Current Realities – Defining the Completion Agenda and Its Implications

- Focus on earning degrees, rather than just transfer
- Increased emphasis on reverse transfer as positive for 2-year institutions
- Change of focus for 2-year institutions from "open door" to student success

Current Realities – Completion Agenda

- Data collection to assess student patterns
- Completion rates tied to institutional funding



 Focus on quality as well as attainment

Current Realities – Completion Agenda

- Today's job market requires:
 - Global knowledge and competence
 - Intercultural knowledge and skills
 - Creativity and innovation
 - Teamwork and problem-solving skills in diverse settings
 - Information literacy and fluency
 - Ethical reasoning and decision making

Current Realities – More Attention to Transfer Students

- More partnerships with initial entry in 2-year institutions
 - Pre-advising at the community college

Current Realities – More Interventions (especially State and Federal legislation)

- State incentives with emphasis on time-to-degree
- Federal Higher Education Act
 - June 30th deadline
- Foundations
 - Focus on partnerships and student success strategies

More resources needed!

Current Realities – More Options for Earning Credit

- Concurrent Enrollment, Dual Credit, Single Site
- Experiential learning (prior learning assessment)
- MOOCs
- Military Training Evaluation (ACE)
- Expansion of online learning methodologies
- CLEP, advanced placement exams

Challenges - Higher Expectations from Employers and Accreditors (SLOs)

- Increasing need for education
- Accreditation
- Federal intervention regarding transfer credit



Strategies - Recruitment / Admissions

- Recruitment is broader than just the Admissions Office
- Relationships need to be built with counterpart institutions – greater sense of equity



Strategies - Recruitment / Admissions

Creation of process for transfer

- Yearly review of transfer equivalencies
- Updates to transfer articulation agreements
- Yearly meetings with advisors from partner institutions
- Meet and greet sessions
- Presentation partnerships

Strategies - Orientation

- Online prior to campus arrival
- In-person
 - Importance of advising
 - Student involvement
 - Exploring resources
 - Time management
 - Early transfer registration

Strategies – Transitional Experiences

- Transfer orientation course
- Courses reserved for transfer students
- Student mentoring programs
- Seminar for students who experience first-semester academic difficulties

Strategies - Online / Electronic Advising

• Variety of formats needed



Strategies – Retention / Graduation / Persistence to Degree

- New ways to track and count transfer students (National Student Clearinghouse)
- Time-to-degree initiatives between 2year and 4-year institutions
